205 (d) The goods and services recited in collective trademark and
206 collective service mark applications are assigned to the same
207 classes that are appropriate for those goods and services in
208 general.

209 (2) The establishment of the classes of goods and services set
210 forth in subsection (1) is not for the purpose of limiting or
211 extending the rights of the applicant or registrant. A single
212 application for registration of a mark may include any or all
213 goods upon which, or services with which, the mark is actually
214 being used comprised in one or more of the classes listed, but
215 in the event that a single application includes goods or
216 services in connection with which the mark is being used which
217 fall within different classes of goods or services, a fee
218 equaling the sum of the fees for registration in each class
219 shall be payable.
