CLE Presentation – Title: “Rejection, Assumption and Assignment of Intellectual Property in Bankruptcy” by Mariane L. Dorris, Latham, Shuker, Eden & Beudine, LLP, Orlando

Description: There is currently a split of authority among the federal circuit courts on whether Section 365 of the Bankruptcy Code permits a debtor-licensor to reject a license agreement and terminate the licensee’s rights that would otherwise survive the licensor’s breach under non-bankruptcy law. This presentation will address this split and discuss the Supreme Court’s pending decision in *Mission Product Holdings, v. Tempnology LLC* that is expected to resolve this split. The presentation will also address the related issues of rejection, assumption and sale of trademark/patent licenses.
