**XIII. CLE Predictive Coding**

Predictive coding is a lawyer driven, yet computer assisted, automated review of electronically stored information. While the technology behind predictive coding is as inventive as its name suggests, the process for using predictive

coding in discovery is quite simple. This CLE will focus on practical considerations in using e-discovery technology, the lawyer's role in reviewing data, and recent legal authority addressing predictive coding.

Through case studies and the presenters' personal experiences with computer assisted review, this course will also demonstrate how the technology enables lawyers to process voluminous amounts of electronic data efficiently, expedites discovery, and reduces the costs associated with traditional document review.
